Community and school information: Family Tree Private School opened in the 1999-2000 school year, and is based in Palm Beach County, Florida. The school provides the opportunity for K- 12 regular and special education students statewide, to receive one-on-one assistance and guidance as families and students take responsibility for their education. Family Tree Private School has four diploma options, and utilizes a vast array of opportunities through collaborative efforts with other educational institutions, and uses a multitude of course work and curricula from well respected and researched based educational products. Annual standardized testing is required, and testing options are available based upon students' needs, status and diploma option.

Family Tree Private School is accredited by the [Florida Coalition of Christian Private Schools \(FCCPSA\)](#), which is [identified by the Florida Department of Education](#), and specializes in non-traditional Florida Christian private schools, and is licensed by the [Florida Department of Children and Families to license faith based child care facilities](#). FCCPSA is also a recognized accrediting association of the [Florida High School Athletic Association \(FHSA\)](#), Family Tree Private School is cleared through [The National High School Athletic Association \(NHAA\)](#) and is registered with [the College Board](#), and the [Florida Parent Educator's Association \(FPEA\)](#). The school supports a strong, Biblically based approach to schooling and family life with high academic standards. Though a Biblically based philosophy is emphasized, all are invited to enroll including the "un-churched". There are no racial demographics available, though most major ethnic groups are represented in the school population.

Family Tree Private School has articulation agreements with community colleges for [Dual Enrollment](#), [Florida Virtual School](#), various learning support groups, on-line learning events, local classes and scholarship programs. The students have accessed scholarships available to all private schools such as, Bright Futures and the McKay Scholarship. One example of collaboration is in the utilization of the McKay scholarship wherein parents would choose full time placement services at Nova Southeastern University's TLC Speech and Language program for the profoundly autistic, while being enrolled in Family Tree Private School. The school also facilitates group activities normally associated with the homeschooling community. Before the mid 80's in Florida, what was considered at that time as *homeschooling* was conducted exclusively in the realm of private school enrollment. Today, as in many other states, these

students are still considered private school students, when enrolled in a recognized school. Since our unique make-up and progressive approach is unfamiliar to some school counselors, our administrators are happy to answer questions, provide relevant Florida statutes & documentation.

Curriculum: Curriculum is assigned from one or more of the following courses of study; [Accelerated Christian Education](#) (The School of Tomorrow), [The American School](#), [A Becca](#), [Alpha & Omega](#), [Rod & Staff](#) , Florida Virtual School courses, Dual Enrollment and other high quality, researched based curricula. The academic program is divided into 2 semesters per year, on a quarterly schedule. The school offers 4 diploma options, Vocational, Standard, College Track and Honors. A minimum of 25 credits is required for graduation as well as at least 75 hours of community service. One credit is equal to 150 instructional hours.

Grading and ranking procedures: Students are graded using an un-weighted, 4.0 grading scale for course work. Overall GPA is determined by averaging grades with consideration of standardized testing to support the GPA. A student’s GPA is computed using quality points. Beginning with grade 9, all subjects whether passed or failed are included in the computation. The school does not participate in a “ranking” schedule nor track percentages of Post-High School Placement statistics, yet the school’s graduates have been accepted to in-state and out-of-state colleges, such as; Palm Beach Community College, Broward Community College, South University, Barry University, University of South Florida, Lynn University, Florida Atlantic University, and The University of New Mexico, to name a few. Graduates have also been accepted into several branches of the military.
